## **Background**

In 2021, the US Department of State (DOS) adjusted its Travel Advisory Levels to more closely mirror Travel Health Notices issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). This shift was a direct consequence of the ongoing COVID pandemic. The result was that many countries around the world were issued a DOS Level 4 Travel Advisory ±Do Not Travel. - x Given the recent changes above, individual petitions for study in countries, regions and areas with DOS and CDC Level 3 or 4 designations will not be required. In lieu of student petitions, the International Study Risk Management Team (ISRMT) will review all countries carrying a Level 3 and 4 and determine which countries and programs will be open to students.
- x If the ISRMT determines that study in or travel to a particular country is not approved for students, OCSE will notify the affected student of the decision. At that time, OCSE will work with students on alternative plans.
- x The ISRMT will continue to monitor the status of the countries in which student study and travel has been approved and will reassess approval and disapproval of travel if there are significant changes to risk factors on-site. It is possible that the Travel Advisory Level of a country could change while a student is studying in or traveling to that country. If the level changes to a DOS Level 4 Advisory, Skidmore will inform students of the change, provide guidance around enhanced safety protocols, and determine if students are required to depart that country. Departure from their country of study may also be required if the CDC level rises to a Level 4 Warning or Travel Recommendation. In emergency situations, Skidmore College and/or the program provider will determine the best course of action. Once a determination is made, students will be required to adhere to the decisions reached by Skidmore and/or the program provider. - x All final decisions will be reviewed by the Vice President for Academic Affairs and the Vice President for Finance and Administration.
- x **Note**: Students may not travel independently to a DOS or CDC Level 4 country, region or area at any time while participating on a Skidmore-sponsored program or activity unless prior approval has been granted.

Since conditions in a country can change quickly, it is important that you are aware of the current travel advisories and adhere to them. In order to do so, you **must** take the following steps:

- x Review the U.S. Department of State Travel Advisories for the location in which you will be studying at https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/traveladvisories/traveladvisories.html
- x Enroll in the U.S. Department of State Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP) at https://step.state.gov/step/. This program will allow the following:
  - o Receive updated Travel Advisories from the U.S. Department of State.
  - Receive important information from the U.S. Embassy about safety conditions in your destination country.
  - Help the U.S. Embassy contact you in an emergency, whether natural disaster or civil unrest, in order to provide advice or assistance.
